How the Masters think

It's a little known fact that great musicians have a fundamentally different way of approaching the guitar.

If you are feeling held back in your playing, it's useful to look at how the masters think to find out how to move past your current limitations.

What is mastery?

'Mastery' is a word that's easy to throw around, but what does it mean?...

...Is it even possible to 'master' the guitar?

Well, it depends on how you define mastery.

We can define mastery as:

The ability to enter a chosen musical situation with total competence - and -

The ability to express oneself authentically and effortlessly

This is definitely an achievable goal. Knowing this, the master musicians goes after mastery directly. In doing so, *continued overleaf*

Blues is the basis of rock soloing



If you want to play great rock solos then learning the blues is a great to place to start. Most of the greatest rock guitarists of all time learned blues first, and are actually using the same blues chops in a rock context.

From learning the minor pentatonic and the language of blues, you are also only two notes away from any minor modal pattern.

From here, many styles become accessible very easily and simply.

The blues gives you a foundation in improvisation and expression which you can go on to apply in any context.

The right note at the right time – how to start

Many guitarists are confused Try this: about how to hit the 'right notes' when they are playing a solo

The secret is to fit with the backing chords.

right now is to hit 'target notes'.

A target note is a note that fits very well with the chord that is being played. The simplest way to do this is to hit the root note of the chord This exercise is taught in more in your solo.

1) Learn where the 1, 4 and 5 are in you minor pentatonic scale. These are your targets. 2) Learn the 12 bar blues sequence like the back of your One thing you can learn to do hand. You can only solo as well as you know the sequence.

> 3) Create phrases that end on the target that corresponds to the current chord. e.g. During chord 1, end your phrase on the 1 of the scale.

What skills do I need to develop to master my instrument?


There are 6 skills which every musician needs to work on. They are shown in the picture to the right. They can be put into three separate categories.

> **Aural Skills** Repertoire Technique

Most musicians have skills mainly in one area. A master needs to have a complete set of skills.
